You need to know

- Tax cuts will be a major theme for the 2022 legislative session.
- OSHA ETS (vaccine and testing rule) was blocked by the Supreme
- Important legislation has been filed in the first week. Read all legislation filed.

Comprehensive Tax Reform for 2022

- · Tax cuts, referred to as comprehensive tax reform, are a leading theme coming from the Governor and both Chambers, although it's not clear if there is an agreement on specifics this early.
- Local Option Sales and Services Tax: While most of the conversation is focused on income tax reform, Senator Dawson, the Chair of the Senate Ways & Means Committee, made it clear that the Senate proposal will trigger IWILL. There are two ways this could occur:
 - First, lowa could increase the state sales tax. This proposal is politically difficult because it would be a tax increase.
 - The second way would be to remove the Local Options Sales and Services Tax that many cities have locally approved and make it a state sales tax. This would divert significant resources away from local governments.
- While language has not yet been published, we remain concerned that cities and local governments could be affected by a statemandated tax shift.

OSHA ETS Blocked by Supreme Court

- The Supreme Court blocked the enforcement of OSHA's "vaccine or test" requirement. This rule had already faced trouble in lowa, where Iowa OSHA had stated that it would not adopt the emergency
- The Supreme Court agreed that the challengers are likely to prevail in the OSHA case because they are likely to succeed on their claim that the Secretary lacked the authority to impose the mandate.

Governor Reynolds Delivers Condition of the State Address

- During Condition of the State Address, Governor Reynolds focused much of her time discussing lowa's workforce and specifically touching on taxes, teachers, public safety and the unemployment system.
- Various proposals from the Governor are still being drafted, and the League has not yet seen legislative language with details.

HSB 534 | Cybersecurity as an Essential Corporate Purpose

- Adds the "improvement of city information systems to protect against a cybersecurity event" as an essential corporate purpose under Code of Iowa Chapter 384.24
- · Passed out of a House Subcommittee on Thursday.
- This legislation reflects the modern understanding that cybersecurity infrastructure is essential to the protection of city operations.
